She works with faculty to expand their inclusive practices and conducts research with students to ensure their educational experience is equitable. Drape earned her associates degree at Morrisville State College, bachelors and master's at Cornell University, and Ph.D. at Virginia Tech. A long time ago, Tiffany was a NYS FFA Officer, the NYS Star Farmer, and competed in several CDE's at the state, regional, and national level.
